

DID YOU KNOW?

- Knowing how to speak a second language will make it easier to learn a third language.
- Using language in a variety of subjects increases the students' flexibility with the language.
- English speakers, despite learning through two languages, excel in their native English, scoring higher than peers studying only in English.
- Many large worldwide companies will not even consider a potential employee for a job unless they are able to communicate with ease in at least two languages.

Nearly 40 years of research has shown that immersion students score significantly better on standardized tests than non-immersion students.

WHAT IS DUAL LANGUAGE / IMMERSION?

Dual language / immersion programs are an exciting option for parents who want their children to have the advantages of a rigorous academic program while also learning two languages – English and a target language. In a Spanish immersion program, Spanish is not taught as a subject. Spanish is the language in which instruction is delivered

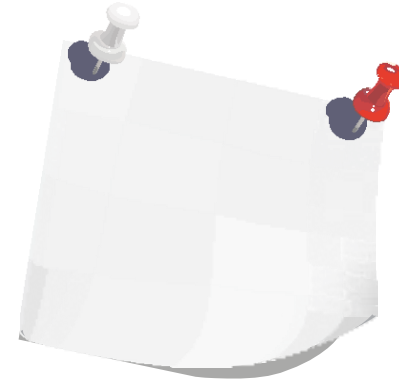

- **Bilingual and bi-literate:** Students achieve high proficiency in the immersion language.
- **Increased cultural sensitivity:** Immersion students are more aware of and show more positive attitudes towards other cultures and an appreciation of other people.
